



BOWL ALBERTA CLASSIFIED CUP

FORMAT:

- **Scratch Events** – Average as of (See **Bowl AB Calendar of Events**).
- Open to all bowlers 18 years of age or older as of December 31st of the current bowling season, who are registered in an ADULT MEMBER CENTRE LEAGUE.

General Rules:

- An initial entry fee at the Centre Round level charged by the proprietor.
- All rounds shall be Scratch.
- In all rounds, if a bowler who has qualified to advance is unable to do so, the position shall be filled by the next eligible bowler from the proceeding round.
- Once the replacement has been made, the original bowler may not return to compete at any stage.
- Latecomer Rule: Latecomers shall start to score when they arrive. Only legally bowled frames will be counted, and all frames missed shall be scored as zero.
- Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers Assoc. rules shall apply at all levels.
- The location (host) of the Provincials shall be determined each season and provided to all participants as soon as possible.
- All disputes shall be settled by the Bowl Alberta Official present at the time of the Championships.
- 5 person teams, MUST include one bowler from each average class:
 - Class 1: 0-155
 - Class 2: 156-175
 - Class 3: 176-195
 - Class 4: 196-215
 - Class 5: 216 and Up
- Tie Breakers: No tiebreakers shall be held. All cash prizes for any tied positions shall be divided equally amongst all teams and players involved.
- You may bring a bowler up from a lower class to a higher class if need to fill a team position.

Centre Round:

- All bowlers must use their league ending average or avg date (See **Bowl AB Calendar of Events**) for new bowlers.
- The number of bowlers advancing from the Centre Round to the Championships shall be based on the proprietor's decision, which is pre-determined based on Program Registration completed.
- All Centre Round Finals shall be a minimum of 4 games and held no later than (See **Bowl AB Calendar of Events**). **Bowlers pay their own lineage.**

Provincial Round:

- Bowl Alberta Classified Cup starts at 10:00 AM and will be divided into North and South Provincials.
- Championships will be five (5) games. **Bowlers pay their own lineage.**
- The final Cash Prize Payouts and medallions shall be determined by the Bowl Alberta Board each year.
